C.S. Lewis Academy operates its K-12 program on an 8-acre campus in Newberg, Oregon.

History

Founded in 1985, as C.S. Lewis Community School, CSLA is currently in its 40th year of operation. The school merged with Chehalem Valley Academy in 2002, and with Open Bible Christian School in 2013. After years of multi-campus operations, the entire school began operating from a single campus in 2016-17.

Statement of Purpose

Section I. Mission Statement

C.S. Lewis Academy is committed to providing an education that is challenging and responsive to individual needs; preparing students for life in a safe, nurturing environment that fosters character development and spiritual growth based on Biblical truth.

Section II. Philosophy of Education

The educational process in a Christian school is dependent on a Biblical philosophy, which provides a biblical worldview and essential truths for life so that students may be prepared to assume their proper place in the home, church, and state. Accordingly, the philosophy of education for the school is as follows:

CSLA's educational philosophy is based on a Christ-centered view that all truth is God's truth. Our goal is to provide a worldview which produces a balanced personality and a proper understanding and acceptance of a person's role in life at home, work, play, and worship, all grounded in the Christian concept of love. Our intent is to impact students spiritually, mentally, intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally. We hope to raise up young men and women to godly service, to train them in Biblical principles, responsibility, proper behavior, and citizenship, in order that they may grow to be strong Christian leaders in the future. This will be achieved through Christ-centered teachers integrating God's Word with a high-quality academic program and by providing students the opportunity to develop their spiritual gifts and ministry skills.

Religious Denominations

CSLA Students attend many different churches in the greater Yamhill County area. Nondenominational chapel services are held at the Elementary, Middle, and High School levels weekly on campus for students and staff. Church attendance is not a requirement for enrollment, yet encouraged.

Faculty and Staff

For 2025-26, C.S. Lewis Academy employs a total Faculty and Staff of 35 who fill 29 .8 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) positions. Of those, 26 (19.05 FTE) are faculty members/Aids.

The majority of our faculty members have earned advanced degrees and/or are Oregon State licensed. Our staff also represents many different community churches.

Finances

The 2025-26 operational budget is approximately \$2M. Yearly, approximately 9-11% of the operational budget is supplemented with outside income in the form of fundraising and gifts. Financial Aid is provided to approximately 18-22% of CSLA students each year.

ACADEMIC

School Schedule

C.S. Lewis Academy Elementary (K-5th) grade classes are self-contained while the Middle School is semi-departmentalized. The Middle and High school operate on a six-period day. All schools have a late start on Wednesdays to allow for meetings and other programs. The school follows a semester calendar model.

SAT/ACT Test Data

Although as many colleges are not requiring standardized testing, since 2017, 95% of our senior students have elected to take the SAT and/or ACT. (The Oregon average is typically around 50%). Our classes have routinely performed at or above the Oregon average for both tests and well above the National average.

Achievement Testing

C.S. Lewis Academy utilizes the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP®) testing, a product of the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA). The NWEA is a global not-for-profit educational services organization with more than 7,400 partners in U.S. schools, districts, education agencies, and international schools.

High School Graduation Requirements

C.S. Lewis Academy requires 28 credits. Transfer credit is determined on a student-by-student basis. CSLA requirements meet the State of Oregon diploma requirements.
